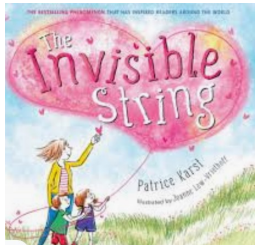

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Fishing for Ice

Materials

Plastic cup

Ice cubes

Salt and a spoon for sprinkling the salt

About 12 inches of string



Directions

- Put a few ice cubes in the cup and fill it with water
- Try to “fish” for an ice cube with the string. Observe what happens
- Place the string across the top of an ice cube
- Sprinkle a little bit of salt on the ice cube
- Count to 100!
- Pull the string out and observe what happens
