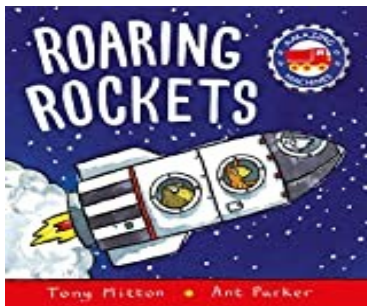

MOON ROCK COUNT & THROW

Materials:

- Aluminum foil
- A basket
- A paper to write numbers

Instructions:

- Cut the aluminum foil and form it into 10 small balls. (Pretend they are moon rocks)
- Cut the paper into rectangles and write one numeral on each, 1 through 10
- Turn the cards upside down. One person chooses a number.
- If number 6 is picked, stand back from the basket and throw 6 moon rocks into the basket
- If you throw all the rocks into the basket for that number, you win! (More than one person can win each game!)





PUFFY PAINT PLANETS

You'll need:

- 1/2 cup shaving cream
- 1/4 cup white glue
- Food coloring (Red ,blue, green, yellow—whatever is available)
- Cut circles of white construction paper

How to make puffy paint:

1/2 cup shaving cream + 1/4 cup white glue + food coloring

How to make puffy paint planets:

- Take the construction paper circles.
- Paint the circles with different puffy paint colors.
- Let the circles dry. The circles become beautiful planets.
- Once dry, you can glue the circles onto a piece of black paper or hang them from your ceiling
