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# FAIRY TALE MATH CASTLE

#### **Materials**

Several pieces of paper in different colors

Large piece of paper

Glue stick

Markers, crayons, or pencils

Scissors



#### **Directions**

Cut many different shapes such as triangles, circles, squares, diamonds, and ovals from the colored paper. Build a castle by arranging them on the larger piece of paper, glue the shapes down, and decorate.

#### Follow-up activity:

Kids can do their own writing, or just practice writing the numbers in on the lines.

# Inquiry Challenge: HOW WILL YOU BUILD A BEANSTALK?

#### **Materials**

Picture of a castle (or Fairy Tale Math Castle)

(Dragonflies can use the castle they made with Miss Kasia)

Tape

Blocks, Legos, etc.



#### **Directions**

Attach the picture of the castle to a wall, at whatever height you want. Ask your child to design and build a "beanstalk" to help them reach the castle like in *Jack and the Beanstalk*. They can use Legos, blocks... whatever they think is best!
